**Doug** is a freshman who showed up at my Bible study a few weeks ago. I met with Doug a few days later to get to know him and to tell him a little bit about Campus Crusade.

After sharing the gospel with him, Doug realized that he had never fully accepted Christ. He made that decision and now we are meeting for follow-up.

Nina is a freshman who we've asked you to pray for. Just this past week, Jen was meeting with Nina again, to help her get closer to making a decision for Christ.

After going through some Bible study material, Nina realized for the first time that she was a Christian. However, she had never experienced the assurance that she actually was saved and accepted by God. Because she did not have this assurance, she was hesitant to call herself a Christian, for fear of being a hypocrite.

In April, we will be hosting our first annual Fellowship Dinner. It's an event designed to highlight our ministry to the community and give people an opportunity to partner with us as we seek to reach out to students on campus in a culturally relevant way.
