students are taking the gospel to the world.


Our vision is starting to become a reality. This next summer, a staff couple on our team is leading a missions team to Shymkent, Kazakstan. Many of our students are planning to join them.

Another aspect of this partnership, is sending Short Term International teams (STINT) over for a year or two at a time to help expand on the ministry of the summer project.

This Spring, we will graduate the first group of students from our ministry. At least two of them are applying to go to Shymkent for a one year STINT. A few other students are thinking about joining Campus Crusade's full-time staff, to help reach other students on other campuses and in turn send them to the world.
