


There is tremendous competition for the minds and hearts of students.

How they are influenced in college will most likely affect them for the rest of their lives.








mind can come within reach through the metaphor of existence in another life. Join us for a guided tour of a pre-

bag, and a notebook.








In the face of intense cultural pressures and hostile ideologies, we are seeing God bring increasing numbers of students into a relationship with Himself.




Our heart is that every college student would get a chance to hear about Jesus Christ.








We help students grow in their relationship with God by:




Our ultimate goal is to reach the 100 million college students of the world.




These are just a few of our worldwide ministries.
